

Mission: *Develop, support, and retain effective principal leaders who are dedicated to student success in Sacramento's Capital Region.*

The Principals' Academy is grounded in our beliefs that:

- Schools today require principals who can skillfully lead both instruction and a very complex organization. School leaders work in a context of increasing demands, often with decreasing resources and occasionally while navigating turbulent politics. How well principals lead matters for the success of the teachers and students they serve.
- School leadership is demanding, with a majority of principals acknowledging that the job is getting more complex and half of principals reporting that they lack access to quality training. Systems leaders recognize the importance of leadership development, but capacity challenges and other demands often prevent a systematic approach to skill building.
- The quality of school leadership matters. As California and many states across the nation experience teacher shortages, teachers report two criteria that top their lists in terms of job satisfaction and remaining in the profession: the quality of their colleagues and the quality of school leadership (Fullan, 2014).¹

OVERVIEW

The Academy builds principals' essential and relevant knowledge and develops effective leadership strategies with a focus on equity practices. The Academy's goal is to reshape professional learning for school leaders with participants mastering practices needed to tackle real challenges in their schools. Principals' Academy graduates have skills that enable courageous action and the know-how to implement innovative solutions to the complex problems they face daily.

The Outcome: Principals will have the knowledge, skills, and vision to lead collaboratively, equitably, and in a way that transforms schools where all staff and children can thrive.

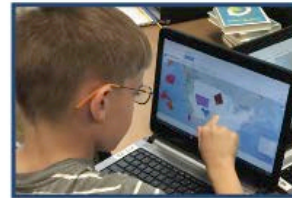
